## *Just recently:*

On February 15, 2006 Support & Trustee Advisory Services (STAS) hosted a working luncheon for professionals at the Mississauga Convention Centre. The purpose of the luncheon was to inform lawyers and financial planners about the unique challenges parents face when future planning for their child who has a disability. In attendance were 18 lawyers from Mississauga, Brampton, Bolton, Oakville and Toronto as well as 7 financial planners from Mississauga and Etobicoke. The presenters were Bonnie Yagar, lawyer, who explained "Henson Trusts Do's and Don'ts", and Kevin Longley, financial planner, who spoke about the financial considerations that parents must make when planning for their child who has a disability. Their message was clear: the professional's families with a family member who has a disability work with must be knowledgeable about the complexities of preparing financial plans and wills and familiar with the unique challenges that these families face with regard to future planning.

Support & Trustee Advisory Services has prepared a list of the professionals in attendance which we make available to interested parents looking for information/resources to assist them with their future planning process. STAS plans to host other similar seminars for professionals in the future.
